A CALL TO FAST

"Is this not the fast that I have chosen: To loose the bonds of wickedness, To undo the heavy burdens, To let the oppressed go free, And that you break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, And that you bring to your house the poor who are cast out; When you see the naked, that you cover him, And not hide yourself from your own flesh? Then your light shall break forth like the morning, Your healing shall spring forth speedily, And your righteousness shall go before you; The glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; You shall cry, and He will say, 'Here I am.'" Isaiah 58:6-9 (NKJV)


Fasting is an important discipline in scripture. In Matthew 6:16, Jesus does not command us to fast but rather speaks about it from the assumption that we are already doing it ("And when you fast...")! Fasting means to willingly abstain or reduce some food or drink (or both) for a period of time with the purpose of seeking and depending on the Lord. There are many different types of fasts held in the Bible including partial fasts, like in Daniel, or absolute fasts (no food or water). Fasting in scripture always included food or meals, but you can include abstaining from things like TV, social media, etc. with the purpose of spending that time with the Lord. When considering how or what to fast remember, if it is important to you, it is important to God! You are not fasting to try and manipulate God into action in your life. You are humbling yourself before him and giving something to Him as a sacrifice with the desire to go deeper in your relationship with Him. The goal is more of Him! God honors that type of sacrifice with the promise that when we seek Him, we WILL find Him!

With that being our intention, look at all the benefits of humbling ourselves in true fasting as recorded in Isaiah 58! Do you want strongholds to be broken? Heaviness to be removed? Greater effectiveness for God's kingdom? Healing? God's protection and rear–guard? Revival within our city and nation? Fasting brings these things because that is what He already desires for us and He honors the heart of His children as they seek after Him. Do not view this time of fasting and prayer as a dread or punishment, but as a time of great expectation! God's heart is for you to draw close to Him.

Ask the Holy Spirit what He is putting on your heart to fast during this period of corporate prayer and fasting. Write it on the provided line below as a vow and commitment before the LORD during this time.

FEAR OF THE LORD

SCRIPTURE

Proverbs 9:10, Isaiah 40:25-26, Job 38, Revelation 1:8

Have you ever seen a landscape that made you stand in awe? A great way to understand the phrase "fear the Lord" is to think about it in a similar way: to "fear the Lord" means to stand in awe of God's majesty, power, wisdom, justice, and mercy. It is to have an exalted view of Him, keeping Him in the space of our minds and hearts that He deserves. As we embark on this journey together, take time to reflect on the majesty of God and allow the "awe" you have for God to move your heart deeply toward His will in your life. Truly, the fear of the Lord is the beginning of all wisdom.

REPENTANCE FROM SIN

SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 6:1-7, Acts 3:19, Romans 3:23

Were you and I to see God in ALL His fullness, we would be completely undone and likely scream in His presence, as Isaiah did in Isaiah 6:1–7. This is because God is completely unlike anything any of us has ever seen or encountered in this world. Our world has lost its sense of awe and fear of God, so let us pray for ourselves first and our neighbors second to have encounters with God through Christian witnesses in the workplace, church, family, and social lives, as well as through the extraordinary means of visions and dreams if necessary, and for us all to repent and turn from our sins that we might obtain mercy through Christ.

GREAT GRACE



2nd Corinthians 5:21, John 3:16-17, 1st John 1:8-2:2, John 8:1-11

Mercy is not getting what you deserve, but grace is getting what you don't deserve. You know what you don't deserve? You do not deserve salvation, restoration, healing, forgiveness, righteousness, a second chance, or any other gift from God. All of these are given freely to us from our Heavenly Father who loves us. You can't earn them. You can only receive them with a thankful heart! Give thanks to God today for the benefits He gives us by His grace.

PEACE WITH GOD

SCRIPTURE

Romans 5:1-2, Psalm 103:7-12, Luke 19:10

It's hard to believe God's first reaction towards sinners is not one of vengeance and retribution. Yet, scripture shows us time and again, that God's character is one of peace. He disarms himself to draw us close. Desiring peace He accepted defeat and death. In choosing sides, He chose ours first. Let us follow God's example and raise our white flag to Him.

Matthew 5:8, 1st Peter 1:13-16, Galatians 5:16, Hebrews 12:1-2

SPIRITUAL INTIMACY

SCRIPTURE

John 6:68, Psalm 27:4 (really verses 1-6 are all good), Psalm 116:1-2

Before Jesus commissioned Peter, He asked him this thought-provoking question three times: Do you love me? The reality is that this question is the foundation of so many things in our spiritual lives. True spiritual intimacy with the Father begins when we accept that we are loved without limits or conditions, and then love Him in return. When we accept this truth, we can do the "right things" out of a love for Him instead of out of obligation. Do you do the "right things" out of your love for the Father or out of religious duty? Take time to explore the heart of the Father through silence and allow your intimacy with Him to grow.

SCRIPTURE

Matthew 7:24-27, Psalm 91, Romans 8:11

When we build our lives on Him and His word...the storm may come, in fact it comes to the wise and foolish alike, but we can have great peace knowing we are hidden under the shadow of His wing. Luke 15:11-27, 1st Peter 3:1-2, Psalm 34:18

NEEDS



Matthew 6:25-34, Philippians 4:19, Psalm 37:25

Psalm 23 says, "The Lord is my Shepherd; I lack nothing." This statement from the Psalmist implies that the Lord provides all that we need (physical, spiritual, emotional, and relational). It might be hard at times to understand this truth when we feel the strain of life with its complexities and difficulties, but believing this truth is a choice we must make daily. BLESS THOSE WHO CURSE US

SCRIPTURE

Galatians 6:7-10, Ecclesiastes 12:13-14, Luke 6:27-36

The very language of God is heavy with the verb of forgiveness. Through salvation, He has immersed us in understanding it's boundless breadth and depth. God calls us to forgive as He forgives. Letting go of grudges, working towards reconciliation, not harboring bitterness or seeking revenge are the ways of forgiveness shown to us by which we are to show to others.

FORGIVENESS + UNITY

SCRIPTURE

Matthew 18:21-35, Psalm 133:1-3, Ephesians 5:31-32

Forgiving others as we have been forgiven is hard work made especially difficult when people sin against us repeatedly or in such a monumental way that it has continued repercussions in our lives (abandonment, robbery, murder, etc). In these cases, we have to enter the spiritual discipline of forgiving others as we have been forgiven—wholly and completely through Christ. In doing so, we will be forced to grow in humility and the strength of Christ who is the only one capable of forgiving others to the degree that we need to. Take time to bring before God people whom you need to forgive and be proactive enough to pray blessings on those people who have hurt you as a step toward your healing and theirs.


GENEROSITY

EDUCATION + SCHOOLS



Proverbs 1:7, Proverbs 9:9, Psalm 119:129-130

Therefore, we must commit to a stronger formation process in the church and in our homes to ensure our children, even though surrounded by Babylon, will not bow to the idols of culture. PRAY FOR OUR CITY



Hebrews 13:1-3, Philippians 1:27, Psalm 127:1

The Bible and Christian history is replete with care for the poor. When Christianity first started, wealthy Christians attended church alongside impoverished believers and found ways to serve them. The Apostle Paul was eager to remember the poor (Gal 2:10) and God's blessing is upon those who help them (Ps 41:1). Our goal is not to eradicate poverty, as Jesus says this is impossible (Matt 26:11), but to serve them. In doing so, we serve God Himself (Matt 25:40) and store up treasure for ourselves in Heaven (Luke 12:33). Our town has many tangible needs right here that could be greatly alleviated if believers worked together to solve them. Seek the Lord for how He would have you love and minister to the poor and take some practical steps to do this.

PRAY FOR OUR NATION

SCRIPTURE

Titus 3:1-3, 2nd Chronicles 7:14, Colossians 3:11-15

Scripture commands that we pray for our leaders. It seems now more than ever that our country needs repentance, healing, and God's grace. It's important to remember that as followers of Jesus, we cannot pray only for those we agree with. In your time of prayer, simply ask the Lord to give wisdom and steadfastness to our governmental, educational, and economical leaders. It is not enough that we just pray for them; we must also do our part by acting as Christ in the world. Pray these words: 'Lord, help me to be a light in a dark world, not merely by what I say but by how I live to reflect Your glory.

PRAY FOR OUR WORLD

SCRIPTURE

Psalm 46:1-2;10, 2nd Thessalonians 3:2, Philippians 1:27-30

Candles do not work well in the daylight, but they are powerful and penetrating in the darkness. There is a lot of darkness in our day, but we do not need to be afraid. This is not our home. Colossians 3 says we should fix our eyes on the realities of heaven. Philippians 1 says we must live as citizen of heaven. Our peace is not dependent on the circumstances of this world. Our peace is found in the rock of Jesus Christ. From that peace, we let His light shine forth into a dark world filled with wicked and terrifying things. Do not put your light under a bowl, but let it shine brightly! Ask the LORD to highlight a country, region, political situation, and/or people group that is struggling today and pray for them.

PASTORS + MINISTRY LEADERS

SCRIPTURE

Galatians 6:6, Hebrews 13:17, Numbers 6:24-26

Statistically, this is among the worst times ever to be a pastor in America. There are many reasons for this but regardless, our pastors—your pastor—need your love, support, encouragement, and prayers. Pray for them and their families. Ask God to keep them from temptation and make them bold for bringing about the Kingdom of God here in Chattanooga. If you want to be really serious about helping your pastor, a huge way to help out would be to pray and ask God what you can do to alleviate burdens or fill a need at the church. Is there some place you can volunteer and encourage others to do so? Pray for your pastor and about how you can help, and then follow through.
